

Korea Electronic Travel Authorization (K-ETA) Required for Entering Jeju Island (Starting September 1, 2022)

- Starting from September 1, 2022, K-ETA will be required for ALL travelers entering the Republic of Korea including Jeju Island. And they must hold a K-ETA approval by applying on the K-ETA website (or mobile app) before their flight.
- Please read the following information carefully to avoid inconvenience when travelling to Korea.

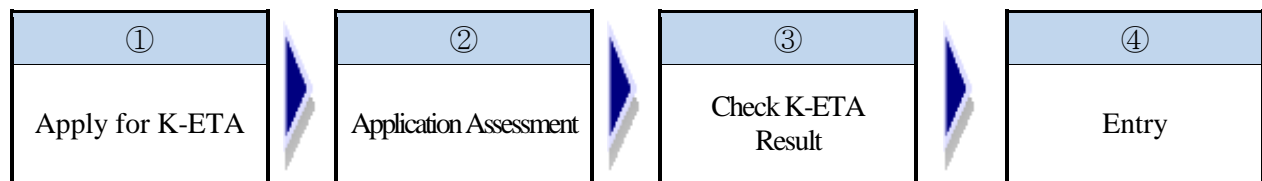

1. Main Contents of K-ETA

1. Main Contents

- K-ETA (Korea Electronic Travel Authorization) is a travel authorization that foreign nationals, who are eligible to travel to the Republic of Korea without a visa, need to obtain by providing personal and travel related information through the K-ETA website (or mobile app) in advance

- Application and Approval Procedure



① **(Application)** Foreign national should apply for the K-ETA on the K-ETA website or mobile application*.

- PC: www.k-eta.go.kr, Mobile App: K-ETA (App Store, Google Play)

② **(Assessment)** Assessment takes normally 72 hours. However, it can take more than 72 hours due to an unexpected increase of applications, the circumstances of the applicants etc.

- Applicants need to apply for K-ETA at least 2 weeks prior to their departure.

③ **(Results)** Applicants can check the K-ETA application status and the result at the official K-ETA website (www.k-eta.go.kr) or mobile K-ETA application (K-ETA).

④ **(Entry)** Those who received K-ETA approval will be exempt from submitting the arrival card.

- K-ETA approval does NOT guarantee your entry to Korea as the final decision is made according to the immigration inspection by the immigration officials.

- K-ETA Required Countries: **104 countries** designated as visa-waiver or visa-free entry countries (Excluding 8 countries that are subject to COVID-19-related temporary suspension of visa-waiver and visa-free entry program from the total of 112 countries that are permitted visa-free entry to Korea)

- K-ETA Fee: 10,000KRW (3% of the card commission fee may apply)

- K-ETA Validity: 2 years from the date of approval, regardless of number of entries within the validity period

- However, if your passport expiry date, when you apply for K-ETA, is less than 2 years, the validity date of the K-ETA will be until the expiry date of the passport.
